

- [Hackers continue attack on Pakistani sites, leak sensitive data](#) (Dawn News)



Username, password and email addresses, allegedly from hacks into the **Pakistan Army** and other government websites, were leaked onto the internet. The link to the data dumps are currently blocked in Pakistan, but screengrabs circulating online show private data including names, contact information and worryingly, designations of a sensitive nature including arms manufacturers. Messages included with the leaked data said the attacks were taking place because the Pakistan Army was carrying out an operation in North Waziristan.
